Summary:

In June of 2009 the Juneau Police Department was awarded a grant to fund a new program that we are calling the Police Crisis Intervention Services program. This program was made possible by a four year federal grant through the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance under the Recovery Act Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance. The CBJ Assembly appropriated the grant on June 29, 2009.

The program has the primary function of working with victims of domestic violence and related crimes. The Police Crisis Intervention Specialist position will be available to assist police officers in identifying victims of domestic violence and related crimes and working to connect them with community based programs that will best serve their particular needs. JPD has, and will continue to work closely with A.W.A.R.E. to refine the program as we begin implementing it.
