Subject: Misconduct Controlled Substances 2nd Degree

Summary:

An inspector with the United States Postal Inspection Service intercepted a package heading to Juneau that contained 49 Oxycontin 40 mg tablets. The drugs were removed from the package. The package was addressed to 30 year old Juneau resident Drew MCCURLEY.

On 10-07-2009, at approximately 3:00 pm, officers from the Juneau Police Department, Alaska State Troopers, and United States Postal Inspection Service were present at the Mendenhall Post Office when MCCURLEY picked up the package. MCCURLEY was seen entering a vehicle with another male. Officers followed the vehicle as it drove to the area of the 9000 block of the Glacier Highway. The male with MCCURLEY fled from the area on foot with the package, and the vehicle MCCURLEY was in left in a different direction. Efforts to find the fleeing male were not successful.

At approximately 4:30 pm, MCCURLEY was contacted at his residence. MCCURLEY was placed under arrest for Misconduct Involving a Controlled Substance in the 2nd Degree and lodged at the Lemon Creek Correctional Center on No Bail.

The Juneau Police Department is asking for assistance in locating 31 year old Juneau resident Billy Alton RAY. RAY is considered a person of interest in this case and is sought for questioning.

Investigation continues.

Any charges reported in this press release are merely accusations and the defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.
