Subject: Lucky Me Burglary

Summary:

On 10-15-2009 at 6:14pm, The Juneau Police Department received a report of a burglary that had just occurred at a residence in the Lucky Me community.

Reportedly taken were several firearms and a sizeable amount of cash. Shortly after receiving the initial report, JPD was re-contacted and advised the homeowner had located the suspects and had them detained on the beach. One of them was reportedly carrying a rifle which the homeowner took away from him. JPD officers responded to the scene with the assistance of the United States Coast Guard.

Investigation revealed 22 year old Juneau resident Jesse Jackson, along with a 16 year old juvenile broke into the cabin and took the firearms and cash. The pair also admitted to officers they had broken into two other residences in the area however no reports had been received of the other burglaries and it is not known where the other houses are located. The property taken in the burglary that was first reported to police was all recovered. Several other items also believed to be stolen from the other residences were recovered and investigation into where they might have come from continues.

Jackson was lodged at Lemon Creek Correctional Center on charges of Burglary in the 1st degree a B felony, and Theft in the 2nd degree, a C felony. The juvenile was lodged at the Johnson Youth Center on charges of Burglary in the 1st degree, Theft in the 2nd degree and Misconduct Involving a Controlled Substance in the 4th degree a C felony. Both were held without bail.
