## INFORMATION RELEASE

**Subject: Assault 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Date: 02-23-10**

## **Summary:**

On 02-22-10, at approximately 2:33 pm, the Juneau Police Department received multiple reports of a fight involving 6-7 people occurring on Delta Drive. The people fighting were using ice scrapers, bats and sticks. Prior to officer's arrival two subjects left the area in a black Chevy sedan

Officers arrived at Delta Drive and contacted the people still in the area. Officers also located the black Chevy sedan on the Glacier Spur Road and detained the female driver and male passenger.

The investigation revealed that two residents of the Delta Drive apartment, a male and a female, were sitting outside with several small children. According to the two residents, and several neighbor witnesses, the black Chevy sedan sped into the area. The driver of the black Chevy sedan, identified as 23 year old Juneau resident Meaghan COYLE, exited the car and began screaming at the female about money. COYLE then began assaulting the female victim. The male passenger of the black Chevy sedan, identified as 30 year old Juneau resident Michael Travis MILLER, produced a metal capped wood stick and began striking the female victim. At that point the male resident, and two male neighbors, attempted to stop the assault and took the weapon away from MILLER. COYLE and MILLER then left the area in the black Chevy sedan.

The female victim, a 22 year old Juneau resident, had multiple contusions on her body. The female victim declined medical assistance. The metal capped stick, an ice scraper, and a plastic bat were seized as evidence.

Meahgan COYLE was arrested for Assault in the Fourth Degree, a Class A misdemeanor. Michael Travis MILLER was arrested for Assault in the Third Degree, a Class C felony. Both COYLE and MILLER were transported to and lodged at the Lemon Creek Correctional Center.

Any charges reported in this press release are merely accusations and the defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.
