### **Summary:**

Update 8/27/10

This afternoon officers received information that the telephone call was reportedly from a mental health patient in a hospital in the Vancouver B.C. area. The woman has reportedly contacted numerous police agencies nationwide via telephone with similar stories of being lost or kidnapped.

JPD would like to thank members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police who assisted with the investigation.

On 08/06/2010, at approximately 2:00 am, the Juneau Police Department's Dispatch Center received a call from a juvenile female. The juvenile, who had a heavy British accent, was reporting that she had been kidnapped by an unknown male, dropped off alone at an unknown parking lot in Juneau, and given some unknown drug which was making her dizzy.

The juvenile provided information that her first name was Abby and her last name was possibly MCKENZIE. She said she was 10 years old. She said her parents names were John and Emma. She said she lived in Juneau, in particular the "Valley".

The juvenile gave a number to the phone she was calling from which later came back belonging to a location in Surrey, British Columbia. She disconnected the call to dispatch and did not telephone back. When the dispatchers tried to call the number, it went directly to a voice mailbox.

JPD Officers searched all possible areas in the city, which were similar to what the juvenile said she was looking at. No contact was made.

Contact was also made with RCMP in the Surrey, BC area. They were apprised of the situation and said they would also look into the incident.

If anyone has information concerning this case, they are encouraged to call JPD at 586-0600.

**Any charges reported in this press release are merely accusations and the defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.**
