It also includes holding the line on property and sales tax increases, especially given our community's lack luster economy. Economic development and job growth is ensuring the Juneau Economic Development Plan (Feb. 2015), is the paramount filter through which public decisions are made. Particular focuses of interest are enhancing essential infrastructure, attract and prepare the next generation workforce, protect and enhance Juneau's role as Capital City, and build on our strengths.
