My highest priorities are:

1. Resolve our enormous deferred maintenance backlog in Juneau. The Juneau Capital

Improvement Plan (CIP) is a good start, but this does not represent the vast need of the city; only the projects we are currently able to fund, and

2. I support efforts to expand Police and Fire services to meet current demand and need and at a pay rate to attract and retain talent among our emergency services personnel.

I also support:

• No person should be discriminated against based upon Race, Color, Religion, Gender and Gender Identity, National Origin, Physical or Mental Disability, Age, Marital Status, Changes in Marital Status, Pregnancy, Parenthood, and/or Political Identity/Identification.

- The proposed JACC should be placed on the ballot for public consideration.
- Funding the Juneau Best Starts early childhood initiative.
- Funding Juneau Schools "to the cap" as permissible in the Alaska Public School Funding Formula.
- Collective bargaining and support project labor agreements.
- Juneau Renewable Energy Strategy (JRES) goal to increase Juneau's "internal community" renewable energy usage share to 80% renewables.

• City funding for avalanche forecasting in years when the snow accumulation warrants it, including Thane Road.

• Pro Choice and Pro-Organized labor
