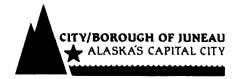

CPI Adjustment to Moorage Fees

The Finance Committee reviewed CPI adjustments to the daily, monthly, annual, and skiff moorage fees at its February 21, 2008 meeting.

Our fee regulation calls for annual CPI adjustment to certain small boat harbor fees unless the Board takes action to keep the rates the same. The Alaska Department of Labor has released the 2007 CPI and it is 2.2%. In accordance with the regulation, the following adjustments are due to take effect on July 1, 2008, unless the Board takes action to keep the rates the same:

Fee	Current Rate	Adjusted Rate
Skiff Moorage	\$500 per year	\$510 per year
Daily Moorage Rate	45¢ per foot	46¢ per foot
Downtown Monthly Rate	\$3.60 per foot	\$3.70 per foot
Auke Bay Monthly Rate	\$6.00 per foot	\$6.15 per foot

In addition, the attached table shows the increase for various size vessels on an annual basis.

Based on our FY 09 budget, the Finance Committee recommends the Board allow the rates to adjust by the CPI.

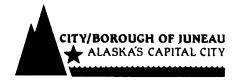

Small Boat Harbor Fees and Charges Regulation Amendments

The Finance Committee reviewed the attached amendments to the small boat harbors fees and charges regulations at its February 21, 2008 meeting.

The first amendment modifies the rounding method for making CPI adjustments to the daily moorage rate. The current regulation requires rounding to the nearest 5ϕ . At the current daily moorage rate of 45ϕ , it would take an annual CPI adjustment of 5.6% before an adjustment would occur. Since I believe it was the Board's intent to have the rates closely track the CPI, I am recommending we reduce the rounding threshold to 1ϕ .

The next amendment removes the annual moorage table from the fee regulation. This amendment is a house cleaning measure, as the table is no longer used.

The final amendment clarifies the definition of residence surcharge and should eliminate any potential for liveaboards to feel that the payment of property taxes exempts them from the requirement to pay a residence surcharge.

The Committee recommends the Board propose the amendments for public comment, hold public hearings at the March 20, 2008 Finance Committee meeting and the Match 27, 2008 Regular Board meeting, and take final action on the regulations at the March 27, 2008 meeting after the public hearing.

A REGULATION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

Amendments to CBJ Administrative Code Title 05, Chapter 20 Docks and Harbors Small Boat Harbor Fees and Charges

PURSUANT TO AUTHORITY GRANTED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, THE DOCKS AND HARBORS BOARD HEREBY PROPOSES TO ADOPT AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1. Authority.** The legal authority for these regulations is set out in CBJ Ordinances 01.60 and 85.02.100.
- **Section 2.** Adoption of Regulations. The City and Borough of Juneau Administrative Code is amended by the repeal and adoption of regulations in Title 05, Chapter 20 as follows:

Repeal 05 CBJAC 20.030(d)(2) and readopt it as follows:

(2). Each moorage year after June 30, 2008, a fee equal to the previous year's fee adjusted by the Anchorage Consumer Price Index as reported by the Alaska Department of Labor for the calendar year preceding the start of the moorage year, rounded to the nearest cent, unless the docks and harbors board takes action to keep the fee the same as the previous year.

Repeal 05 CBJAC 20.190 Annual moorage table

Repeal 05 CBJAC 20.050(a) and readopt as follows:

- (a) Definition. A fee assessed to the owner of a vessel when the vessel is used by any person as a residence, dwelling, or abode for three or more calendar days in any calendar month, unless the
 - (1) owner pays daily moorage in accordance with 05 CBJAC 20.030 for all days in the calendar month during which the vessel is used as a residence, dwelling, or abode; or
 - (2) Harbormaster authorizes the owner to use the vessel as a residence, dwelling, or abode for more than three calendar days in any calendar month, provided the authorization is for a short term, temporary use of the vessel as a residence.
- **Section 3. Notice of Proposed Adoption of a Regulation.** The notice requirements of CBJ 01.60.200 were followed by the Docks and Harbors Board. The notice period began on February 29, 2008, which is not less than 21 days before the date of adoption of these regulations as set forth below.

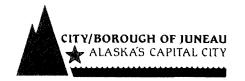

Proposed Regulations for Parking Management

Proposed regulations for parking management are attached.

The Operations Committee reviewed draft regulations at its February 12, 2008 meeting. Since that time, I have met with the Law Department and the Police Department. Based on these meetings, we modified the draft regulations and determined that an ordinance change to Title 85 is required for effective administration of the harbor parking areas. A draft ordinance change is also attached for your review.

Besides changes to regulation and ordinance, we will need to resign the lots, revoke and reissue parking permits, and publish procedures for administering the permits and lots. Management of our parking areas has become a rather complicated undertaking.

I recommend the Board proposed the attached regulations for comment, hold public hearings at the March 18, 2008 Operations Committee meeting and the March 27, 2008 Regular Board meeting, and take final action on the regulations at the March 27, 2008 Regular Board meeting after the hearing.

A REGULATION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

Proposed Amendments to Administrative Code Title 05, Chapter 45 Docks and Harbors Small Boat Harbor and Port Facilities Use Regulations

PURSUANT TO AUTHORITY GRANTED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, THE DOCKS AND HARBORS BOARD IS PROPOSING TO ADOPT THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:

Section 1. Authority. These regulations are proposed for adoption pursuant to CBJ 01.60 and CBJ 85.02.060.

Section 2. Adoption of Regulations. The City and Borough of Juneau Administrative Code is amended by the adoption of a new section in Title 05, Chapter 45, Small Boat Harbor and Port Facilities Use Regulations, reading:

05 CBJAC 45.055 Parking Management.

- (a) Policy. It is the policy of the Docks and Harbors Board to allow for and regulate the use of parking and loading areas by persons who are actively using a boat harbor or port facility appurtenant to the parking and loading area. It is further the policy and intent of the Docks and Harbors Board to not allow the use of parking and loading areas by persons who are not actively using an appurtenant boat harbor or port facility.
- (b) Geographical Applicability. This regulation applies to the geographical areas used for parking and loading that are appurtenant to a boat harbor or port facility, as those terms are defined in CBJ 85.02.010, and all long term storage areas designated by the Port Director. These geographical areas include, but are not limited to, the parking and loading areas at:
 - (1) Douglas Harbor and along Savikko Road;
 - (2) North Douglas Boat Launch;
 - (3) Harris Harbor and Aurora Harbor, including the area along Harbor Way;
 - (4) Fisherman's Terminal;
 - (5) Norway Point Lot;

- (6) Statter Harbor and the Horton Parking Lot;
- (7) Amalga Harbor Boat Launch;
- (8) Echo Cove Boat Launch; and
- (9) all areas under the administration of the Docks and Harbors Board adjacent to the Steamship Wharf, the Cruise Ship Terminal, and the Intermediate Vessel Float.
- (c) Relationship to Other Parking and Loading Area Regulations. The requirements set out in this section 05 CBJAC 45.055 apply to the regulated areas in addition to the requirements set out in 05 CBJAC 10.060 (Loading permits), 05 CBJAC 15.080 (Loading permit fees), 05 CBJAC 20.090 (Statter Harbor Lower Parking Lot permit fees), 05 CBJAC 20.160 (Statter Harbor parking lot fee), and 05 CBJAC 45.050 (Auke Bay Loading Facility). If in conflict, the requirements set out in 05 CBJAC 10.060, 05 CBJAC 15.080, 05 CBJAC 20.090, 05 CBJAC 20.160, and 05 CBJAC 45.050 shall take precedence over the requirements set out in this section.
- (d) Parking and Loading Zone Designations and Requirements. The Port Director is authorized to designate the parking and loading areas at the boat harbors and port facilities, establish rules governing the use of the designated areas, install signs for administering the designated areas, including the applicable provisions of the American with Disabilities Act and the Maritime Security Act, and undertake actions necessary for enforcement.
- (e) Time Limited Parking and Loading Spaces. The Port Director is authorized to designate time limits for parking and loading spaces, install signs administering the limits, and to undertake actions to enforce the limits.
- (f) Parking and Loading Permits. The Port Director is authorized to require and issue permits for the use of parking and loading spaces and areas. The Port Director shall publish written procedures for issuing and administering the permits.
- (g) Long Term Storage. The Port Director is authorized to designate areas where persons may store vehicles, trailers, and other marine-related items on a long term basis. Designation of such areas must not

interfere with the normal day-to-day operations of a boat harbor or port facility. Person using such areas shall pay storage fees as set out in 05 CBJ 20.130. The Port Director shall publish written procedures for administering the long term storage areas.

- (h) Collection of Parking and Loading Fees. The Port Director is authorized to take reasonable actions to simplify the collection of parking and loading fees, including the installation and operation of payment boxes, payment devices, and pay-in-advance procedures.
- (i) Removal of Vehicles, Trailers, and Other Items. The geographical areas regulated under this section are considered "private parking spaces" under CBJ 72.12.070, and the Port Director is authorized to remove vehicles parked those areas in violation of this section. The Port Director is authorized to remove items other than vehicles parked or otherwise located in the regulated areas in violation of this section. The owner of the vehicle or items is responsible for all costs associated with the removal. "Vehicle" has the meaning as defined in CBJ 72.28.010.
- (j) Enforcement. Violation of any provision of this regulation is an infraction and is enforceable as set out in the applicable provisions of CBJ 03.30. In cases of negligent or unsafe operation of a vehicle or other item at a parking area, loading area, or storage facility, or non-payment of parking, loading, or storage fees, the Port Director may prohibit a person from using a parking area, loading area, or storage facility.

ORDINANCE

CBJ 85.10.050(k) is amended to read:

- (k) Vehicle parking.
- (1) The port director and the port director's assistants are authorized to enforce CBJ Chapter 72.12, Parking, in all off-street, municipal parking facilities located adjacent to municipal boat harbors and withing the right-of-way for the street adjacent to Harris Harbor and Aurora Harbor. and all parking and loading area management regulations adopted by the Docks and Harbors Board under CBJ Title 85, at all areas used for parking and loading that are appurtenant to a boat harbor or port facility, as those terms are defined in CBJ 85.02.010, and all long term storage areas designated by the Port Director. In the event of a conflict between CBJ Chapter 72.12 and the parking and loading area management regulations adopted by the board, the regulations shall apply. The areas covered by this subsection (k) include, but are not limited to, the parking and loading areas at:
 - (A) Douglas Harbor and along Savikko Road;
 - (B) North Douglas Boat Launch;
 - (C) Harris Harbor and Aurora Harbor, including the area along

 Harbor Way;
 - (D) Fisherman's Terminal;

- (E) Norway Point Lot;
- (F) Statter Harbor and the Horton Parking Lot;
- (G) Amalga Harbor Boat Launch; and
- (H) Echo Cove Boat Launch.
- (I) all areas under the administration of the Docks and Harbors

 Board adjacent to the Steamship Wharf, the Cruise Ship Terminal, and the

 Intermediate Vessel Float.
- (2) CBJ Chapter 72.14, Parking Payment Boxes, shall not apply to the parking areas listed in subsection (k)(1) above. The Port Director is authorized to establish procedures and fees for parking payment boxes, if any, for the parking areas listed in subsection (k)(1) above.
- (3) In the performance of these duties such duty, the port director and the port director's assistants shall have all the powers of a police officer of the City and Borough.



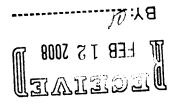

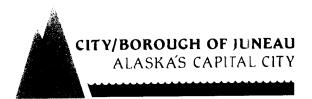
