#### **PROJECT MANUAL:**

Item No. 1 Item No. 1: SECTION 00800 – SUPPLEMENTARY GENERAL CONDITIONS, SGC-4.6 USE OF THE CBJ LEMON CREEK GRAVEL PIT.

➤ **Delete** paragraph C., and **replace** with the following paragraph C:

C. CONTRACTORS that choose to extract material from the CBJ material source shall request and comply with an Individual Mining Plan prepared by the CBJ Material Source Manager. CONTRACTORS shall also secure a Performance Bond to ensure compliance with contract provisions, including any Individual Mining Plan stipulations. The bond shall remain in full force and effect until a release is obtained from the CBJ. A \$10,000 cash processing restoration bond is required prior to screening or primary crushing operations.

➤ **Add** the following paragraph:

K. Contractors choosing to perform screening or primary crushing shall comply with all requirements of Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) Part 46, and must obtain a Contractor ID number (7000-52) from MSHA.

Item No. 2: SECTION 00800 – SUPPLEMENTARY GENERAL CONDITIONS, SGC 4.7 - USE OF CITY STABLER POINT ROCK QUARRY. **Add** the following Note after "...is not available for this project.":

**Stabler Point Rock Quarry Note:** Contractors choosing to purchase material from an operator within Stabler Quarry shall follow all requirements of MSHA Part 46 where applicable. Truck drivers hauling from the quarry are not required to have MSHA training provided they do not perform mining/quarry work (i.e. loading, drilling, crushing) while within the quarry site.
