Ken- FYI We immediately began doing Arts Ed things like you suggest, starting in March - and they are continuing to work!

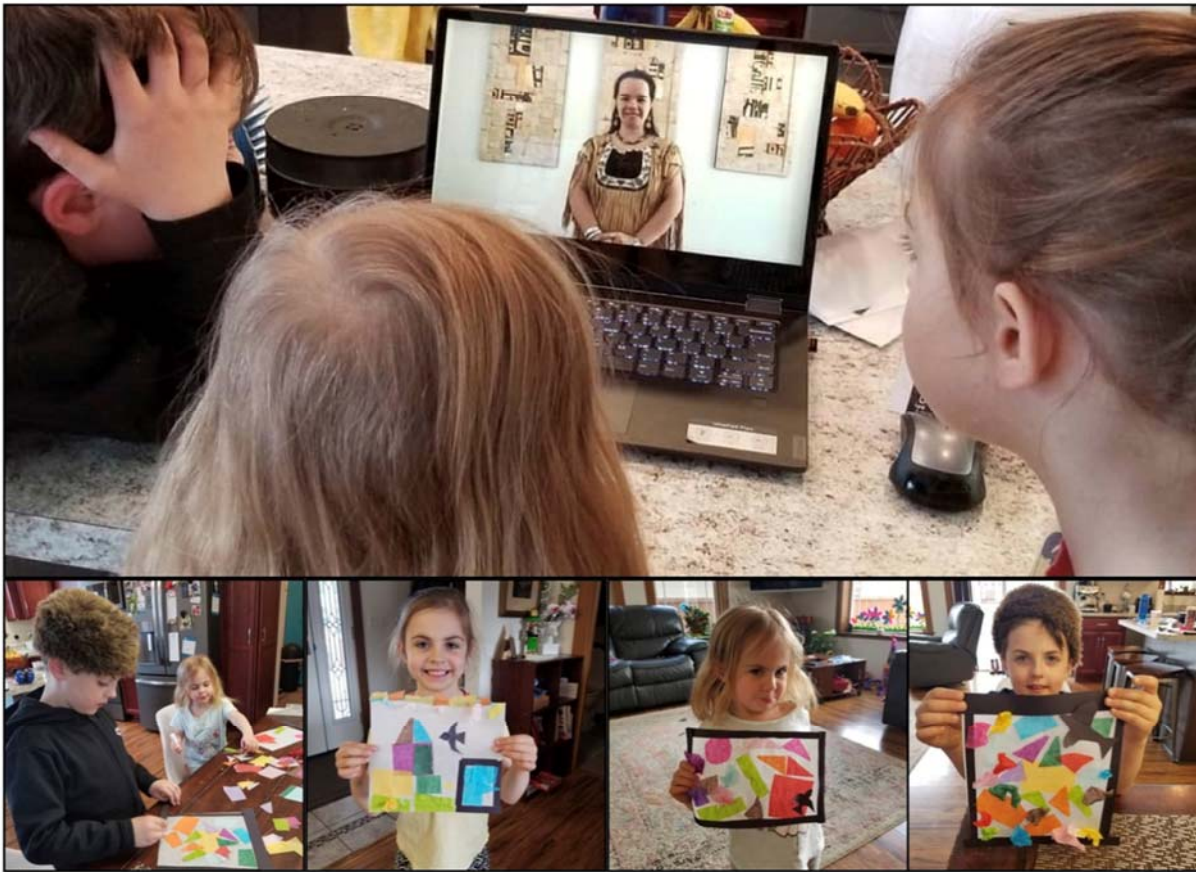
