Hello! Below is a summary of the information you've requested in order to make a decision on the Extreme Hardship Grant Proposal. Please let us know if you have questions on the information provided.

- 1. Allen Marine was forced to lay off all seasonal staff and all but 40 of our year-round full time staff due to the federal/state shutdown.
 - a. EE's 4Q19 166
 - b. EE's 1Q20 47 (70% staffing reduction PRIOR to tour season when we employ an additional 500+... combined year round and seasonal staffing reductions is 93%)
- 2. Since cruise ships weren't allowed to stop in Canada due to the closure of their border, Jones Act prevented ships from sailing directly from Seattle to Alaska resulting in zero outside tourism from cruise ships... and then cruise ships cancelled sailings for the entire year. There was also a substantial reduction in independent tourism due to quarantine requirements, Covid testing, and basic social distancing restrictions.
 - a. Juneau passenger count 2019 188,848
 - b. Juneau passenger count 2020 627 (all independent travelers)
