In January 2021, Wildlife Services completed an annual review and evaluation of the Juneau International Airport (JNU) Wildlife Hazard Management Plan (WHMP), in accordance with 14 CFR 139.377 (f)(6). During the course of the annual review Scott Rinkenberger (Airport Maintenance & Operations Superintendent), John D. McComas (Wildlife Biologist), and yourself met together to review JNU’s WHMP to update and modify it accordingly so that it may continue to be a current tool in managing the wildlife on and around our airfield. The determined course of action was to update the timetables set in place of completed projects in our WHMP and have the FAA Certification Inspector review and approve it in accordance to 14 CFR 139.337. Following is a review of the major revisions to the JNU WHMP.
