Upon discussion it was agreed that no councilman would properly be eligible for this office, and by consent of the second Mr. Forrest withdrew his motion.

Mr. A. Blum then moved, and was seconded by Mr. McKinnon, that Mr. W. H. Moore be appointed Treasurer for the City of Juneau, which motion carried unanimously.

G. P. Forrest then made a motion which was duly seconded and carried, that the Judge of the United States District Court of Alaska be requested to fix the amount of the bond to be required of said W. H. Moore as Treasurer of the City of Juneau and the clerk is hereby instructed to mail to the Hon. Melville C. Brown, Judge for the First Division of the District of Alaska, a certified copy of this motion, with a request that he reply at the earliest possible moment, fixing the amount of said Bond.

There being no further business the motion of B. M. Belvids that the Council adjourn until July 5th at 2 P.M. was entertained by the Chair and duly carried.

Mr. Robinson presided at this meeting and outlined the general policy as agreed on by the Board. He submitted plans of addition and repairs to be made on the present School house, to make it suitable for the present wants of the Town; and these plans were discussed at length; he submitted further that the School Board had advertised for bids according to these plans and specifications, the lowest of which was \$3682.00 made by J. J. Jorgenson, which the Board had accepted as the lowest and best bid. He thereupon asked that the City Council approve this expenditure.

Messrs. Robinson and Casey then retired and the City Council was called to order by Councilman Delaney, President protem Maloney being absent.

A motion was made and seconded that the Council accept the report of the School Board and approve the expenditure of \$3682.00 for the purpose of building an addition to the present School House, as per plans and specifications submitted by J. J. Jorgenson. The motion was put and the result not being decisive, the ayes and nays were demanded, and upon roll call the following vote was recorded.

Mess. L H. Jones and W H Matlock were then placed in nomination for the office of Pound master, Mr Jones receiving five votes and Mr Matlock two. Mr Jones was declared duly elected City Pound master.

The flues and chimneys for conducting smoke in all buildings or other structures within the Fire limit of this City shall be constructed of good hard brick or stone and shall have walls not less than four inches thick and shall be well plastered inside. All chimneys in buildings that are not built up from the ground, shall be supported by good substantial posts or timbers from the foundation. No chimney shall rest on brackets, except it is less than eighteen feet in length and the bracket must be well and substantially built.

No stove pipe or other metallic smoke conductor shall enter any flue or chimney at a point nearer than eighteen inches from any ceiling or floor. Provided, that in all buildings now constructed within the said Fire limits in which Terra Cotta flues are now in use the same will be permitted to remain in use provided the owner, lessee or occupant of said building or structure shall within thirty days from the date of this ordinance taking effect, encase said Terra Cotta flues within a casing with a space of four inches between said flues and casing which space shall be well packed with clay.

No stove pipe or other metallic smoke conductor shall hereafter enter any flue or chimney unless the same is at least eighteen inches from either the ceiling or floor; and in all cases where smoke pipes pass through stud or wood partitions or floor or ceiling they shall be guarded by a band of brick cement or earthenware not less than three inches thick or a double metal flange with an chamber not less than

two inches thick and perforated to allow the free passage of cold air - Any Person or persons erecting or maintaining any stove pipes Terra cotta flues or Chimneys or using those that are now erected after a period of thirty days from and after the time of this ordinance taking effect contrary to and in violation of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and any such stove pipe Terra cotta flue or chimney so maintained used or erected contrary to the provision of this ordinance and in violation thereof may be abated and removed by the City Marshal under direction of the Board of Fire Wardens after giving the person so using, maintaining or erecting said stove pipe, Terra cotta flue, or chimney such notice as the Board of Fire Wardens may direct not to exceed ten days.

Unanimously carried

Upon motion it was unanimously decided to refer Ordinance No 2 back to the Committee with instructions to take under consideration the building of brick chimneys within the Fire limits

Ordinance No 3 was then offered by the Committee and by unanimous consent was laid aside temporarily

Upon motion it was then decided to proceed with the election of City officers

Section 23. When Real property is sold for delinquent taxes the City Treasurer must immediately make and deliver, a Certificate of Sale, to the Purchaser which shall set forth a description of the property sold, the amount it sold for, the year in which tax was levied, the name of the purchaser and that the sale is made subject to redemption within one year from the date of the certificate. The owner or his successor in interest or any person having a lien, by Judgment, decree, or Mortgage, on any property sold, may redeem the same at any time within one year from the date of the certificate of sale, by paying in lawful money of the United States to the purchaser, or to the City Treasurer for his use, the purchase money and twenty percent thereon and all taxes which the purchaser may have paid thereon.

Section 24.
