He found the report to be true, that there had been 110 to 120 cases of small pox at Sitka, but that only three deaths had occurred there and that the deaths were probably due to other complications as the small pox was of a mild character - 700 natives had been vaccinated at Sitka and very many of the natives had left the town undoubtedly carrying the contagion with them as it was ascertained the disease had broken out at Hoonah, Kluksnoo, Saxman and Haines Mission.

Dr. Morris of Skagway who had been engaged by the Steamship Co. and others to take the same trip for a like purpose, addressed the Council corroborating Dr. Leonhardt's report.

Mr. Ethel Oh, President of the Chamber of Commerce addressed the Council on the subject and a general discussion of the situation followed.

It was finally decided to adjourn to 8:30 A.M. to give the Health Board time to formulate plans for the protection of the City.
