Resolved That in all cases of the indigent sick the Health officer must make an examination and report to the Mayor, and if in their judgement the case is a proper one for the City to aid the said Health officer may by a written order signed by the Mayor and Health officer have the patient taken to the Hospital for treatment and care - The City will not be responsible for any patient unless upon a written order of the Health officer signed by the Mayor. And in no case will the City pay more than one dollar per day for each patient until discharged, provided that no patient shall be retained in the Hospital after such patient is in a condition of health to be discharged and in no case beyond thirty days from date of acceptance therein; and the Health officer is hereby instructed to visit such patient and report weekly to the Mayor upon his or her condition.

Proceedings of the Juneau City Council at a meeting held at the rooms of the Chamber of Commerce Dec. 23, 1902. The Mayor presiding.

Present Councilmen Adsit, Decker, Miller, Morrison, Price, Valentine and Young.

The Mayor stated the object of the meeting was to consider the matter of a better water supply for the town.

The proposal of the Juneau Water & Power Co. submitted at the last meeting of the Board was read.

Mr. Donohoe attorney for the Juneau Water & Power Co. presented a letter from G.W. Garside stating that he knew the officers of the Juneau Water & Power Co. and that they were financially able to carry out their proposal, and offered a contract between the Juneau Water & Power Co. and the City of Juneau for a supply of water for city uses for \$150.00 a month, the contract to run 20 years. J.J. Clarke, Mr. Summers, Mr. Wheelock, Mr. Forrest, Mr. Davies and other citizens present addressed the Council.

Mr. Valentine moved that the contract be accepted as read. Seconded by Mr. Morrison.

Mr. J.F. Malony addressed the Council and offered to furnish the City with exactly the same service as proposed by the Juneau Water & Power Co. for the sum of \$125.00 a month provided Judge Brown and Judge Hanford would give an opinion that the City Council had a right to enter into such a contract, he to pay for the opinion if favorable and the City to pay if the opinion was not favorable, and further offered to deposit \$1000 at once guaranteeing the proposal and should the contract be agreed to, to deposit a certified check on the Bank of California for \$100,000 with either the First National Bank or B.M. Behrends as a guarantee that the contract would be faithfully carried out.

Mr. Donohoe on behalf of the Juneau Water & Power Co. met Mr. Malony's proposition by offering to take the contract for \$125 a month without an opinion as to the Council's legal right and guaranteed to protect the City from any legal expense that may be incurred in the matter.

Mr. Malony offered to accept the opinion of any two reputable lawyers in Juneau in lieu of the opinion of Judges Brown and Hanford.

Mr. Morrison moved to amend the motion before the Board to make the contract read the amount to be paid to be \$125.00 per month. Seconded by Mr. Valentine. Chair ordered roll called on the amendment.

Councilmen Adsit, Decker, Miller, Morrison, Price, Valentine and Young voted aye.

Chair declared the amendment carried.
