Sirs:

As you are aware, the Government has purchased the whole of Block No. 19 of the Townsite of Juneau on which it proposes to build a U.S. post office and custom house. Letters have been received by this office from the Treasury Department requesting information concerning curb elevations, sidewalk widths, official grades, etc. upon said block

We would like to know whether there are official curb elevations, sidewalk widths, and grades established by ordinance on Fourth, Fifth, Main + Seward Streets, which enclose said Block No. 19. If none have been so established, will your honorable body be pleased to so establish the same at an early date? If for any reason this cannot be done by you, we respectfully request that you by resolution, authorize the Government to establish the same and when so established adopt the same as the official curb elevations, sidewalk widths, and grades of said Fourth, Fifth, Main and Seward Streets as they relate to said Block No. 19.

No street levels or grades have been established.

Now: Therefore be it

Resolved: By the City Council of the City of Juneau, Territory of Alaska, in regular session assembled.

That the United States Government, is hereby authorized, and empowered, to establish: with the approval of the City Council, such street grades as may be deemed necessary and appropriate: surrounding and adjacent to the aforesaid Block 19 of the townsite of the said City of Juneau.
