Whereupon Bell, seconded by Fries, moved that the election of Ed. Hurlburt by the Fire Department as Fire Chief be confirmed. Said motion was put and carried unanimously. Whereupon it was moved by Miller, seconded by Bell, that the bond of H. E. Biggs as City Wharfinger be accepted and approved. Motion was carried unanimously. Whereupon it was moved by

Holland, seconded by Fries, that the bond of A. W. Fox as City Magistrate be accepted and approved. Said motion was carried unanimously. Whereupon Gray moved, seconded by Bell, that the Committee on Streets, Sewerage, Lights and Wharfage be empowered to have printing done on account of the wharf & to incur any necessary expense in the introducing of a system of accounts for the City Wharf. Said motion was carried unanimously.

April 19 - 1912

Whereupon Holland, seconded by Gray, moved that the Mayor be empowered to see that the material belonging to the Alaska Ebnor Gold Mines Co. stored on lower Franklin Street be removed & to give the necessary notice to the owner of said material; also to notify the same Company that if its material stored on the City Dock be not removed it would be subject to ordinary storage rates on and after May 1 - 1912, ~~the~~ Said motion was carried unanimously. Whereupon Holland moved, seconded by Gray, that the Wharf Committee confer with H. E. Nowell, Agent of the Alaska Steamship Company, with regard to the rates charged his company for wharfage at the City Dock. Said motion was carried unanimously. A motion by Fries to cut off the salary or pension of Dan. Kennedy was ordered to be laid over until next meeting.

Whereupon Gray, seconded by Fenner, moved the adjournment of the Council until next Friday night at 8 o'clock. Said motion was carried unanimously. Whereupon the Council adjourned.

Proceedings of the Juneau City Council held at the Council Chamber on April 26, 1912

The Mayor presiding.

Present J. H. Bell, C. H. Fries, J. Holland, H. A. Bishop, J. M. Miller and D. B. Femmer; councilmen.

J. R. Hann Ing appeared on behalf of the California Nevada Copper Co in regard to lumber & machinery stored on the City Dock and on Lower Franklin Street. The matter of the storage of the material on Lower Franklin Street went over for about two weeks. The Committee on Streets, Lights & Wharf reported an estimated cost of \$6000 for repairing streets. Committee also reported certain repairs, costs etc, ~~and~~ ^{and} improvements of City Dock about \$2000. Whereupon Holland, seconded by Fries, moved adoption of said report, improvements to include purchase of a 3-ton scale, which said motion was carried unanimously. Whereupon Ordinance Nos 113 and 114, election and compensation of City Officers, on motion of Femmer, seconded by Bishop, were carried passed by an unanimous vote. Whereupon, after a general discussion, Holland, seconded by Bell, moved that the City would enter into no contract, in regard to coal, with the Customs ^{House} this upon a request for a bid, which said motion was carried unanimously. Committee on Home Memorial, relative to taxation matters, reported endorsement of said Memorial. Whereupon Holland, seconded by Femmer, moved the adoption of said report, which said motion was carried unanimously. Whereupon the Committee heretofore appointed to investigate the Alaska Steamship Co. wharfage matter at the City Dock reported through Bell. After a general discussion, Miller moved, seconded by Bell, that the Wharf Committee be empowered to inform the agent of the Alaska S. Co. that they can land their steamers at the City Dock but that the City will collect wharfage on all freight going over the dock and that arrangements similar to those with the Humboldt can be made. The charge for collection of bills if made by the City to be one per cent. Said motion was carried unanimously.
