The Common Council of the City of Juneau Alaska met in the Council Chambers of the New City Hall at one P.M. on Saturday December twentieth nineteen hundred thirteen; Mayor Coater presiding;

members present and answering to Roll call being Councilmen Raymond, Geddes, Hurlbutt, Marshall and Mayor Coater, Councilmen Pullen and Case being absent.

The Mayor stated that the meeting had been called to receive the resignation of W. T. Lucas as City Clerk, Magistrate and Tax Collector for the City of Juneau, and such other business as might come before the Council;

John B Marshall moves that E. W. Pettit be appointed temporary Secretary of this meeting, and Ed Hurlbutt seconds and the Mayor calls the roll on the adoption of said motion, with the following result.

Ayes: Councilmen Raymond, Geddes, Hurlbutt, Marshall and Mayor Coater; absent and not voting Councilmen Case and Pullen; and the Mayor declared the motion carried.

E. W. Pettit thereupon takes the position as temporary Secretary of this meeting;

Mayor Coater thereupon demands from W. T. Lucas his resignation from the offices of City Clerk, City Magistrate and City Tax Collector, to which W. T. Lucas thereupon refuses, unless the City of Juneau agrees to give him his salary for such offices up until April 1, 1914.

Motion is thereupon made by John B Marshall and seconded by H. J. Raymond that the offices of City Clerk, City Magistrate, and City Tax Collector be declared vacant; and the temporary Secretary E. W. Pettit, <sup>at the instruction of Mayor Coater</sup> calls the roll, with the following result;

Ayes: Councilmen Raymond, Geddes, Hurlbutt, Marshall and <sup>Mayor</sup> Coater; absent and not voting Councilmen Case and Pullen;

The Mayor thereupon declares the motion carried.

motion is thereupon made by John B Marshall seconded by H. J. Raymond, that E. W. Pettit be appointed to fill the offices of City Clerk, City Magistrate and City Tax Collector during the period beginning at once and extending to the end of the present Council's term, subject to the pleasure of the Council;

Mayor Carter instructs the temporary Secretary E. W. Pettit to call the roll on the adoption of the above motion with the following result

ayes: <sup>Councilmen</sup> Raymond, Geddes, Hurlbutt, Marshall and Mayor Carter; absent and not voting Councilmen: Pullin and Case.

Mayor Carter thereupon declares the motion carried;

E. W. Pettit thereupon takes the Oath of Office as City Clerk, City Magistrate and City Tax Collector before Guy McNaughten, Notary Public.

Mayor Carter thereupon demands W. T. Lucas to turn over to E. W. Pettit, City Clerk, City Magistrate and City Tax Collector, the combination of the safe in Clerk's office, key for changing combination to said safe, directions for changing combination to said safe, keys to the <sup>Clerk's</sup> office, desk and safe, together with all books, records and moneys belonging to the offices of City Clerk, City Magistrate and City Tax Collector;

Mr W. T. Lucas thereupon refuses to do as requested by Mayor unless the City agrees to pay him his salary as City Clerk, City Magistrate and City Tax Collector up to April 1, 1914.

Thereupon upon motion of Councilman John B Marshall, Mr Geddes seconding, all members present upon roll call voting in favor the claim of W. T. Lucas for salary as City Clerk, City Magistrate and City Tax Collector during the month of December 1913 in the sum of one hundred fifty (\$150<sup>00</sup>) is allowed and the Clerk is ordered to prepare warrant for the same

W. T. Lucas accepting <sup>the</sup> warrant for \$150<sup>00</sup>, the Mayor <sup>then</sup> orders J. T. Martin, Municipal Magistrate to escort the said W. T. Lucas from the Clerk's office, which is done and the said W. T. Lucas thereafter returns and turns over the keys and records to E. W. Pettit City Clerk, City Magistrate and City Tax Collector

Upon motion Council adjourned
