

Regular Meeting Jan 2, 1914.

The Common Council of the City of Juneau Alaska met in the Council Chambers of the City Hall at 8 P.M. on Friday January second nineteen hundred and fourteen; Mayor Carter presiding.

On Roll call the following members answered to their names, to wit;

Councilmen Marshall, Raymond, Geddes, Case, and Mayor Carter.

Councilmen Pullen and Hurlbutt being absent.

The minutes of the Regular meeting of December nineteenth and of the Special meeting of December twentieth, nineteen hundred fourteen were read and approved.

The Committee on Police Protection now reports the proposed Ordinance to provide punishment for Timps and Macques, and said proposed ordinance is read for the second time, whereupon Councilman Marshall moves and all Councilmen second that the proposed ordinance be amended by the addition to the end of Section 1 of the following words: "or a fine of not more than one hundred dollars, or both" and as a result of the adoption of said amendment the following result is had.

Ayes: Councilmen Marshall, Raymond, Geddes, Case, and Mayor Carter, and Hurlbutt and not voting Councilmen Pullen and Hurlbutt. Thereupon the Mayor declares the amendment adopted.

Whereafter Councilman Marshall moves with Councilman Case seconding that the proposed ordinance as amended be approved and adopted, and upon call of roll the following result is had: Ayes: Councilmen Marshall, Raymond, Geddes, Case, and Mayor Carter; absent and not voting Councilmen Pullen and Hurlbutt, and the Mayor declares the ordinance approved and adopted;

Thereupon Councilman ~~Marshall~~ moves and Councilman Geddes seconds that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare an ordinance relative to expectorating on the sidewalks of the City of Juneau and report the same

to the Council at an early date:

The Mayor thereupon announces the motion adopted, and the City Attorney is instructed as per the motion

The Clerk reads a petition from the Royal Fruit Co for permission to use a gasoline lamp in popping corn, in his place of business at the corner of Second and Seward streets

Councilman Case seconded by Councilman Geddes moves that a permit be granted the Royal Fruit Co to use gasoline in their lamp for popping corn as prayed for, but the same to be subject to all ordinances relative to use of gasoline in the City of Juneau;

and the clerk was instructed to call the roll, which was done with the following result

Martin be instructed to go around through the City and find out those who have Federal licenses to carry ^{their} on business and who have not and to report the same at next meeting; upon roll call on the adoption of said motion all Councilmen present voted aye and the Mayor declared the motion carried and instructed Capt J T Martin in accordance therewith

Thereupon Councilman Case reports that the property occupied by Nick Basin on the street leading to the Court House had been reported unsanitary, Councilman

Raymond reported that the sewer leading from the Court House to the Beach was broken and

Councilman and Mayor Carter reported that the sewer over the hill from ^{Chas} Hooker ^{and} near Indian town was broken and

Capt J. P. Martin was instructed to investigate and see that the things complained of were remedied.

Councilman Marshall reports that Treasury Warrant No 308 ^{for sum of \$75.06} had been turned over to the City Clerk, in accordance with the resolution adopted at Council Meeting of December 19th, but that the said warrant was payable to the order of, E. Valentine and that Mr E. Valentine had refused to endorse the warrant so the City could ^{not} cash the same; and upon motion of Councilman Marshall seconded by Councilman Raymond it is moved that the matter be left to a Committee of three, to be appointed by the Mayor, to investigate the matter of said warrant and granting them full power to act in the matter and report at next meeting;

Upon call of the roll by the Clerk on the adoption of said motion the following result is had
Ayes; Councilmen Marshall, Raymond, Geddes, Cass, and Mayor Coster.

Those absent and not voting Councilmen Pullen and Huolbutt.

The Mayor thereupon declares the motion carried and appoints Councilmen Cass, Raymond and Marshall on the Committee and instructs them as per the motion.

Mr. Deowald thereupon addresses the Council and orally petitions for the setting aside by the City of Juneau of a public forum to be used for public speaking and such other purposes as desired;

After which Mr Deowald is requested by the Mayor to confer with the Street Committee of the City relative to said petition;

Upon motion of Councilman Raymond and seconded by Councilman Geddes, the meeting is by vote of all Councilmen present declared adjourned.

Regular Meeting Febr. 6, 1914.

The Common Council of the City of Juneau Alaska, met in the Council Chambers of the City Hall at 8 P.M. on Friday February sixth nineteen hundred and fourteen: Mayor Carter presiding.

On roll call the following councilmen answered to their names: Marshall, Geddes, Raymond, Hurlbutt and Mayor Carter; Councilmen Case and Pullin being absent.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 16, 1914 were read and approved without alteration.

The petition of the students of the Juneau High School for a drinking fountain in the new City Hall was read by the Clerk, after which Councilman Marshall moves and Councilman Hurlbutt seconds that the City Engineer procure an estimate of the cost of installing a drinking fountain in the City Hall and submit the same to the Committee on "Fire Protection and Water Supply". Upon call of the roll all councilmen present voted Aye and the Mayor declared the motion carried and orally instructs the City Engineer in accordance therewith.

The following resolution is presented by Councilman John B Marshall and seconded by Councilman Ed Hurlbutt, viz:

"Resolved that the Mayor and Clerk of the City of Juneau be and they are authorized to execute a certain lease between the City of Juneau, and Charles Goldstein upon substantially the following terms:

Charles Goldstein to lease for a period of one year from Oct 2, 1913. to the City of Juneau certain tide land situate on the water front in the incorporate limits of Juneau, described as follows: commencing at a point 100 ft in the southwesterly direction from the south line and lower Franklin Street on the north line of the Fitzgerald tide lands, and on the South line of the tide land premises referred to as the property of Chas Goldstein, running thence northwesterly 19 feet, more or less, to a point and extending thence for the full width of said 19 feet down to and into deep water of Eastern Channel; reserving unto Chas Goldstein the sole and exclusive use of the inside of the float;" and in consideration of which the City of Juneau agrees to pay a yearly rental equal to the taxes assessed against, and paid by the said Chas Goldstein upon the said tide land described above and the land between the same

and the lower Franklin Street, and it being understood that the tenancy created, shall be a tenancy from year to year, which may be terminated at the end of any year by either party, by giving ten days written notice; that the City of Juneau shall pay the rent at the beginning of each yearly term and is to keep the float now constructed upon the premises, and in case the City fails to pay the rent or in default of any of the conditions then Chas Goldstein can lawfully reenter the premises and remove all persons therefrom."

upon the call of the roll on the adoption of said resolution the following councilmen voted aye.

Marshall, Geddes, Raymond, Hurlbutt, and Mayor Carter; Councilmen absent and not voting. Case and Pullin; The Mayor thereupon declares the resolution adopted;

Councilman Raymond moves and Councilman Hurlbutt seconds, that the clerk be instructed to issue a warrant for each of the claims he now has on hand, bearing the O.K. of the finance Committee, and upon the call of the roll, each Councilman present votes in favor, and the Mayor declares the motion carried, and instructs the clerk in accordance.

Councilman Marshall moves and Councilman Raymond seconds, that the claim of James Duffly for the sum of \$144⁰⁰, for time lost by him caused by an injunction on the New Manhattan Rooming Hse on lower Franklin on June 8 to 14-1913, be placed on the table; and upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion, all councilmen present voted aye and the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Councilman Marshall moves and Councilman Hurlbutt seconds that all the warrants drawn on the general fund of the City of Juneau, until further order, be dated the tenth of the month following the contraction of the debt, for which the warrant is to cover and that the said warrants have endorsed upon them, the following, viz;

"If not paid upon presentation to the City Treasurer, the City of Juneau will pay interest on this warrant at the rate of ten per cent per annum, after date hereof, until paid, and upon the call of the roll on the adoption of said motion the following Councilmen voted aye; Raymond, Marshall, Geddes, Hurlbutt and Mayor Carter, absent and not voting Councilmen, Case and Pullin."

and the Mayor thereupon declares the motion adopted;

7152 Councilman Hurlbutt moves and Councilman Raymond seconds that a warrant ^{on the General Fund} be drawn payable to the order of W. J. McDonald for the sum of \$421.00 same being to settle his bill for painting and contract, except 20% which is withheld awaiting the completion of the painting of the City Hall contract, and upon the call of the roll upon the adoption thereof all Councilmen present voted Aye, and the Mayor declares the motion adopted;

Councilman Huolbitt moves and Councilman Geddes seconds that the claim of B.W. Behrens for \$8⁷⁵/₁₀₀ as damages to sled caused by party using same to haul horse sled to Hogan cabin fire, be laid over until next meeting so that the facts can be investigated, and upon the call of the roll all councilmen present voted aye.

Councilman John B. Marshall now reintroduces and reads a proposed ordinance to provide for General and Special Elections in the City of Juneau Alaska, and the said proposed ordinance is referred to the Committee on Election and Printing to report at the next meeting.

Councilman Geddes is instructed to confer with Mr. Layton and see if Sally Layton will accept a City Warrant ^{dated Jan 17-1914 bearing 10% interest from date} on the General fund of the City Treasurer in full settlement of the last deferred payment as per the agreement between Sally Layton and the City of Juneau dated Jan 17-1913.

Councilman H.J. Raymond delivers an oral request made by the last Grand Jury; that the City of Juneau do something in the way of cleaning up the Red Light District in the City of Juneau; and after arguments as to what step should be taken;

Councilman John B. Marshall moves that the Chief of Police be ordered to close up every Bawdy House in the City of Juneau; and there being no second to said motion, the said motion is withdrawn by ^{Councilman} John B. Marshall.

After which John B. Marshall moves that the Chief of Police be instructed to stop the sale of liquor in all houses of prostitution in the City of Juneau, and if necessary be put on an extra police to aid him and there being no second nothing further is done with said motion.

Thereupon Councilman John B. Marshall moves and Councilman H.J. Raymond seconds, that a letter be prepared ^{and forwarded} addressed to John Rustgard, U.S. District atty First Div of Alaska, stating that the City authorities of Juneau will be glad to lend all the aid they can in the enforcement of the law in the matter of the sale of liquor in houses of prostitution in the City of Juneau; and upon the call of the roll on the adoption of said motion all councilmen present voting in favor. The Mayor declares the motion carried and asks ^{Councilman} John B.

Marshall to prepare such a letter.

The Common Council of the City of Juneau, Alaska met in the Council Chambers of the New City Hall at eight P.M. on Friday, February thirteenth nineteen hundred fourteen; Mayor Carter presiding members present and answering to their names being Councilmen Raymond, Geddes, Marshall, Case, Hurlbutt, Fuller and Mayor Carter

The Mayor stated that the meeting had been called for the following purposes, viz.
presenting and first reading of a proposed Telephone Franchise;
reintroduction and rereading of the proposed election ordinance, for the reason that two members of the Council were absent at the first reading,
reading and action on the Clerk's financial report, and such other matters as may come before the Council.

Whereupon the Clerk reads a report on the City's financial condition.

Councilman Raymond moves, seconded by Councilman Hurlbutt that the report as read, with the following alterations be approved and published in detail in one addition of the Alaska Daily Empire, a newspaper published in the town of Juneau, viz:

The outstanding warrants on the General Fund be itemized showing to whom payable.

That a credit be given the former council to cover the amount of coal on hand at the time this Council assumed charge,

That the salary of the assistant who fingers drawing \$100.00 per month be charged to the Coal account instead of the wharf to.

Upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion all seven Councilmen voted Aye.

Councilman John B. Marshall thereupon reads a proposed telephone franchise ordinance, after which Councilman J.B. Marshall moves and Councilman Hurlbutt seconds that said ^{proposed} telephone franchise ordinance as read, be referred to the

Street Committee to report upon.

Councilman John B Marshall thereupon reintroduces and rereads the proposed ordinance to provide for general and special elections in the City of Juneau Alaska; after which Councilman Hurlbutt moves and Councilman Raymond seconds that the said election ordinance as read be referred to the Committee on Printing and Elections to report at the next meeting, and upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion, all seven councilmen voted aye and the Mayor declared the motion adopted.

The petition of Winter & Ford for permission to use gasoline in connection with a Blow Torch is referred to the Fire Committee to report upon.

upon the call of the roll on the adoption of said motion, all Councilmen present, namely seven, voted aye, and the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Charles Goldstein appears in person and asks for a permit to erect a temporary one story sheet iron covered building on the property belonging to the Mc Grath Estate at the corner of Seward and Second Streets, and that he be granted the privilege of using the City sewer on Seward Street for sluicing purposes in connection with the building of a proposed concrete building on South west corner of Seward and Second Streets.

Whereupon Councilman John B. Marshall moves and Councilman H. J. Raymond seconds that the building permit asked for by Charles Goldstein be granted upon his filing the required application blank properly filled in and signed and that the matter

He agrees that he will advance the money necessary to put the plant in shape to crush rock by building a new hopper, conveyor, enlarging the bin, place track for a car or cars for transporting all the rock to the crusher, and that he will repay himself up to \$500.00 for such money advanced from royalties due the City on account of such lease; that he will furnish rock to any person or persons, corporation or corporations in the City of Juneau that might desire crushed rock during the life of the lease at a price of not to exceed 75¢ per cubic yard; that the rock will be furnished to those desiring it in the order in which the teams arrive at the checks for the same; that he will pay the City a royalty of 10¢ per cubic yard for all rock crushed during the life of the contract; that if after a fair test he finds he cannot crush rock and sell same at 75¢ per cubic yard, then he is to have the privilege of making a showing to the Council with the object stipulating an increase in the amount at which he is to furnish the crushed rock; that he will at the termination of the lease turn

the plant over to the City of Juneau, in as good condition as he receives it, except as to reasonable wear and tear.

Mr. Charles Goldstein is present in person and agrees to all the terms of the proposed contract.

The Mayor asks every contractor present if they desire to bid, and no one makes any offer.

Whereupon Councilman Fries moves and Councilman Geddes seconds that the City of Juneau accept Mr. J. F. Bush's proposition and enter into a contract with him as per the agreement heretofore stated, and that Mr. J. F. Mayor John Rick presiding: Upon call of the roll the following Councilmen answer to their names:

The Street Committee ~~was~~ through Councilman Fries reports that the Committee has interviewed the different property holders along the proposed street on the Water Front, and that R. P. Nelson, Thomas Knutsen, R. M. Keeney, William Myers, William Bosch, J. G. Rowe, Kriegbaum, Mauldin, Stevenson, Clark Smith, and G. F. Broughton, have agreed and pledged themselves to donate the piling for a 20 ft. street upon the City furnishing the necessary materials for capping and planting, the piling and labor necessary for the installation to be furnished by the property holders.

Councilman Miller moves and Councilman Geddes seconds that the City accept the proposition offered by the said property holders on the Water Front relative to the furnishing piling and labor for the installation of said Water Front Street, and that if the citizens along said street desire to continue the road farther that the City will furnish the material on the same proposition, and that the Street be continued as far as the said citizens desire to go; upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion all seven Councilmen present vote aye, and the motion is declared carried.

Councilman Wolland moves that the work of planking Water Front be done by day labor under the direction of the Street Com.

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missioner, and there being no second to said motion, it is laid upon the table.

Councilman Willis moves and Councilman Wolland seconds that the repair of Front Street to the extent that it may be deemed necessary from the Pacific Coast Building to the Juneau Iron Works be done by the City under the direction of the Street Commissioner and that the repair of said street from the Juneau Iron Works down as far as the Street Committee think advisable, and that the Street Committee procure plans & specifications, and call for bids for the said work; upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion all seven Councilmen present vote aye and the motion is declared carried.

Willis E. Nowell, Agent for the A. S. S. Co., appears in person before the Council and complains that it is difficult for the large steamers of the Alaska Steamship Company to land at the City Dock owing to the same being blocked by small gasoline boats, and the matter is referred to the Street Committee to investigate and report at a later date.

Councilman Britt moves and Councilman Fries seconds that the matter of a sewer on 9th Street be referred to the Street Committee and to call for bids, and that they be given the power to act; upon call of the roll on the adoption of said ~~motion~~ all seven Councilmen present vote aye and the motion is declared carried.

Councilman Britt moves and Councilman Miller seconds that the matter of the extension of the City limits be referred to the Committee on Assessment, and that they report on the same at a later date; upon the vote being called said motion is carried unanimously.

Mayor Beck, on behalf of Mrs. M. Bergman, requests that the City instal a light in front of the Bergman House, and that Mrs. M. Bergman will agree to pay monthly the cost of the operating of same; after which Councilman Wolland moves and Councilman Miller seconds that the request of Mrs. M. Bergman be granted and that a light be installed in front of the Bergman House and that Mrs. Bergman pay the City monthly the cost of operating the same; upon putting of the vote the motion is carried unanimously.

Councilman Miller, on behalf of Mrs. M. Bergman reports that there is a stream of water flowing out on the hillside above the Bergman House and the same is running under the foundation of the said house; after which Councilman Fries moves and Councilman Miller seconds that the Street Committee be empowered to look into the matter of the water flowing out, above the Bergman House, and that they be given power to act; upon the vote being called the motion is declared carried unanimously.

Councilman Britt moves and Councilman Willis seconds that the office of Building Inspector be declared vacant; and upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion, the Councilmen vote as follows:

"Ayes" Britt, Miller, Willis, Mayor John Beck;
 "Nay" Wolland; and Councilmen Fries and Geddes refuse to vote;

There being four "ayes" in favor, the motion is declared carried; and the Mayor thereupon declares the office of Building Inspector vacant.

Councilman Miller moves that the Mayor appoint a committee of three to inspect the Bower building below the Court House; and there being no second to said motion said motion is laid on the table.

Mayor Peck announces that nominations for the office of Building Inspector are in order, after which Councilman Willis nominates Richard Wulzen to the office of Building Inspector, and Councilman Miller seconds said nomination, and there being no further nominations, the roll is called on the election of the said Richard Wulzen with the following result;

"Ayes" Councilmen Britt, Geddes, Miller, Willis, Woodland and Mayor John Peck;
Councilman Fries not voting.

The Mayor thereupon declares Richard Wulzen the duly elected Building Inspector of the City of Juneau.

The Clerk now reads the following Resolution;

"Whereas, Section 2 of Ordinance 46 provides that "Any person or corporation desiring to use any sidewalk, street, or alley or any portion thereof during the construction, repair, or alteration of any building or in the making of any necessary repairs or improvements, shall, before the commencement of such construction, alteration, repairs or improvements, make written application to the Common Council of the City of Juneau for the use of such street, alley or sidewalk or part thereof, which permit may in the discretion of said Common Council be granted to such person or corporation upon such terms and conditions and for such time as said Common Council shall deem expedient and proper," and

Whereas, the above applications could not be considered and permits granted by the Common Council except at regular meetings or at special meetings called for such purpose;

Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the Common Council in session assembled this 22nd day of May, 1914, that the Street Commissioners

be empowered and is hereby authorized to view such applications and grant such permits as in his opinion may seem expedient and proper, and by the approval of the Mayor."

After which Councilman Wolland moves and Councilman Fries seconds that the Resolution as read be approved and adopted; and upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion all seven Councilmen present vote aye, and the motion is declared carried.

Councilman Miller moves and Councilman Wolland seconds that the Street Commissioner be instructed not to let any hose, nozzle or spanner be taken by any person without a permit first to do so, and that anybody desiring to use water for any purpose from the fire hydrants obtain a permit before using the same; upon a vote being called the motion is carried unanimously.

The Municipal Marshal is instructed to be on the look out for the violation of the above stated motion, and to take such action as is necessary when such violation is noted.

Councilman Miller moves and Councilman Wolland seconds that a warrant on the special fund be issued to C. W. Winstedt to cover the amount due him on account of his services as Building Inspector; and upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion all seven Councilmen present vote "aye" and the Mayor declares the motion carried.

Councilman Wolland moves and Councilman Fries seconds that in the case of all delinquent taxes due the City, that the penalty be remitted if the same are paid between now and the 1st of June, 1914; upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion the following Councilmen

vote "aye"; Councilmen Fries, Wolland and Mayor John Reck; Councilmen Britt, Geddes, Miller and Willis vote "no"; there being three votes in favor, and four against, the motion is declared lost.

Jack McDonald appears before the Council in person and complains that garbage is being dumped on the Casey-Shattuck Addition above the tide; the matter is referred to the Public Health Committee.

Councilman Wolland reads the following Resolution:

"Whereas, Owing to the growing demands for homes and business locations in the City of Juneau; and the smallness of the area of land embraced within the town-site and whereas it is an absolute necessity that new tracts and additions should be speedily opened for settlement; and whereas the bulk of said tracts and additions lie to the Northward of the City; and whereas about four hundred of the tax-payers have petitioned the Council to open the said North end by the construction of a boulevard around the water-front, to a junction with Indian Street, thence to a junction with the Government Road to the Bar, as being the best means of opening the said tracts and additions, and, whereas, the City should have and hold a certain part of the tide-lands for a fire station and float for small vessels; and, whereas such lands and sites could now easily be secured at the corners of the said proposed boulevard, where there will be open land, in the form of triangles; and, whereas, the proposed street or boulevard is now looked upon by the citizens of Juneau as among the most important matter now before the City Government; and, whereas, all other streets, sidewalks and public improvements have been built and constructed from public funds; and, whereas the people owning property along and adjoining the line of the proposed boulevard have paid their

full share of taxes for the construction of other streets and sidewalks within the town limits, from which they receive no direct benefit;

Now therefore, be it resolved: That the Street Committee of the City Council, City of Juneau, be instructed and empowered to cause surveys to be made and a street to be established and constructed (not less than fifty feet in width) around the water front, and in conformity with the plans set forth in the foregoing, and that they be further instructed and empowered to locate and take possession of sufficient land within the aforementioned triangles for the construction of fire-stations and floats for small vessels; and

Be it further resolved: That all costs and disbursements arising in connection with the construction and carrying out of the aforesaid plans contained in this resolution be paid from the public funds."

After which Councilman Britt moves and Councilman Geddes seconds that the Resolution as read be approved and adopted; after which Councilman Britt and Councilman Geddes consent to the withdrawal of said motion; whereupon, Councilman Wolland moves and Councilman Willis seconds that action on the above Resolution be deferred for one week, or until the next regular meeting; upon the motion being put to a vote the same is carried unanimously.

The Clerk now reads the petition of A. C. Gross, dated May 19, 1914, asking for a permit for the erection and maintenance of a five letter electric sign in front of his theatre on Front Street near Franklin; after which Councilman Willis moves and Councilman Britt seconds that the said petition be referred to the Street Committee, and be given power to act; upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion, all seven Councilmen vote "aye"

and the motion is declared carried.

Councilman Willis moves and Councilman Miller seconds that the claim of Marshall & Newman for \$790⁰⁰ for labor and material furnished the City Dock be approved, and that the Clerk issue a warrant on the Wharf Fund in payment of the same; and further that the Clerk transfer an amount from the Coal Fund to the Wharf Fund to cover the same pending such time as there are sufficient funds in the Wharf Fund; and upon call of the roll on the adoption of said motion all seven Councilmen present vote "aye" and the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Whereas, Because land slides over said roadway are likely at any time to block said roadway and stop traffic to and from the City, thereby impeding development work of the most urgent character; and,

Whereas, The settlement and development of mining and agricultural properties in the section reached by said roadway is proceeding rapidly, and the present roadway is not sufficient to accommodate the traffic along the same; and

Whereas, The only feasible means of constructing a roadway ample to accommodate said traffic is to build the same upon piling for a short distance across the tide flats in front of the property owned by Indian residents of said City of Juneau; and

Whereas, a question has arisen as to the right of the City to construct said roadway across said property without infringing upon the littoral rights of said Indian residents; and

Whereas, The depth of water at high tide on the portion of the tide flats over which said roadway will be constructed is not sufficient to float even the smallest craft and the construction of said roadway will not prevent ingress and egress to said Indian property from the waters of Gastineau Channel and will furthermore be of advantage to the Indian residents adjoining said tide lands; and

Whereas, The property of said Indians and the proposed roadway over the said tide flats have been platted so as to show the relation of said roadway to the tide lands and to the property of said Indians for the purpose of presenting to the Department of the Interior the situation as the same actually exists;

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved, That the Department of the Interior be requested to grant to the City of Juneau the right to construct a roadway across said tide flats in accordance with the plat hereto attached upon the express understanding that the City of Juneau will claim no littoral rights as a result of such grant and will at all times exercise such grant and will at all times exercise such influence as it properly may to preserve the littoral rights

of said Indian residents, and,

Be It Further Resolved, That this privilege, and the plat hereto, attached, be transmitted to the Governor of Alaska, Honorable J. F. A. Strong, with the request that he transmit the same to the Department of the Interior with his recommendation in order that prompt action of the Department may be obtained, because of the urgent need for the construction of said roadway during the present summer."

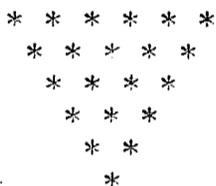

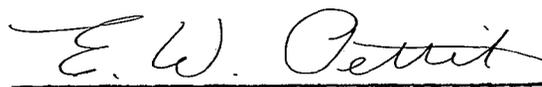
