**Re: Response to Petitioner Committee re: “Mill Rate Cap Change” Charter Amendment
Petition Affidavit**

Dear Mr. Race,

On April 28, 2026, you submitted an affidavit of petitioners committee for a charter amendment petition, short title “Mill Rate Cap Change”.

Legal Review

The Law Department reviewed your submitted proposal and concluded it was in the proper form and was limited to one topic not restricted by Constitution or Charter. They noted that, unlike initiatives and referendum petitions, which are constrained by Charter Section 7.13(b) stating “an election on an initiative or referred measure shall preclude the filing of a new initiative or referendum petition on the same or substantially the same matter sooner than one year after voter approval or disapproval...” Charter Amendments are only subject to Charter Section 7.2-7.9 and timing limitations do not apply.

The Clerk’s Office verified that there were five qualified names presented on the affidavit. As such, the City Clerk will certify and issue signature booklets.

Petition Book Signature Collection & Petition Submission Process

CBJ Charter 7.3 states in part:

*“A petition for initiative or referendum shall be filed in proper form with the clerk **within thirty days** after the date of issuance of petition pages. The petition shall be signed by a number of qualified municipal voters equal to at least twenty-five percent of the votes cast in the municipality at the preceding regular municipal election.”*

The number of votes cast at the 2025 Regular Municipal Election was 10,263, therefore, **you will need a minimum of 2,566 valid signatures** of qualified Juneau voters. We strongly recommend you collect additional signatures.

We will issue seventy-five (75) bound petition booklets for your petition, called a petition instrument. Each booklet contains five pages with room for 10 signatures per page, for a possible

total of 50 signatures per booklet. This provides signature space for 3,750 signatures in total for the petition instrument.

Each booklet must be assigned to a circulator who must print their name on the front cover of the assigned booklet. Circulators must be: (1) a citizen, (2) 18 years of age or older, and (3) a resident of the state. Once that name is printed on a booklet, that booklet may not be swapped between circulators. **Petition booklets may not be left unattended and must remain in the circulator's custody at all times.**

The circulator must sign and attest each page containing signatures in the booklet – they are verifying the number of signatures collected on that page, which they will also record in the certification section. After all signatures for that booklet have been collected, the final page of the booklet contains a certification affidavit that must be completed by the circulator and notarized before submission to the Clerk. Each signature page of the booklet does not have to be completed in full but once the certification affidavit is signed by the circulator and notarized, no new signatures may be collected in that booklet.

Circulators are strongly encouraged to review the inside back cover of each booklet to ensure the affidavit is completed in accordance with CBJ Charter 7.5. Booklets with missing or incomplete circulator affidavits will be deemed ineligible for counting.

Petition booklets will be ready for your group to pick up by Monday, May 18 with the first day to circulate for signatures being Tuesday, May 19. This schedule was mutually agreed upon by the Petitioners' Committee and Clerk's Office staff. By issuing the books on May 19 the 30-day collection period ends on Wednesday, June 17.

The petition booklets must be filed, as one instrument, with our office no later than Wednesday June 17 by 4:30 p.m. While submissions will be accepted until 4:30 p.m., we strongly encourage returning materials by 3:30 p.m. to allow sufficient time for processing, including review and check-in of each booklet and the petition instrument.

Per CBJ Code 29.10.060, all petition booklets and copies of booklets must be surrendered to the election official within 60 days of issuance.
