2026 Walking Tour Descriptions



Historic Downtown Juneau Tour

This walking tour covers about 10 city blocks of the downtown business district and bordering neighborhood. Participants will learn about Juneau's first inhabitants, view totem poles, hear tales of prominent personalities from the early days, and see how the thirst for gold changed the landscape of downtown Juneau. Tour begins and ends at the City Museum. Includes admission to the City Museum and a 20% discount on select items in the museum store.



Alaska State Capitol Tour

The Alaska State Capitol Building in Juneau has served as the symbol and seat of government for more than ninety years and continues to be a working Capitol today. The building hosts the Alaska Legislature, the offices of the Governor of Alaska and Lieutenant Governor of Alaska, and houses an impressive collection historical and contemporary Alaskan art. Tour the interior of the Capitol and learn about the building's architecture, the art collection, the Alaska Legislature, and some of the people who helped to shape Alaska's political history. This tour starts in the Capitol lobby. **No tours on Saturdays or Sundays.**



Evergreen Cemetery History Tour

Explore stories, legends, and heritage on an unforgettable guided walk! Step back in time and pass through the beautiful arboretum that is Juneau's Evergreen Cemetery! Join our engaging history tour and learn about the city's pioneers, gold rush adventurers, and notable residents who shaped the community and region. Experience fascinating tales, local legends, and the art of remembrance on a scenic and sometimes melancholy stroll through this historic site. Perfect for history enthusiasts, visitors, families, and anyone curious about Juneau's rich heritage. Ticket price includes free admission to the City Museum and a 20% discount on select items in the museum store.



Downtown Juneau Geology Tour

This tour highlights the general geology of downtown Juneau and how local geology has influenced Juneau's downtown development and history. The walk is about 1.5 miles in length and will begin at the City Museum. Led by local tour guides, Dr. Cathy Connor, retired Professor of Geology University of Alaska Southeast, and Juneau Naturalist Richard Carstensen. Includes admission to the City Museum and a 20% discount on select items in the museum store.

True Crime History Tours

Offering 2 different tours led by former Juneau criminal reporters, Ed Schoenfeld and Betsy Longenbaugh: **Capital Killers** is about 1.5 miles and focuses on historic cases in Juneau from the first half of the twentieth century. Tour starts and ends at the City Museum. Limited to 15 participants. **Death-in-Douglas:** Participants will walk about 2 miles while hearing about seven murder cases in Douglas and Treadwell from the first half of the twentieth century. This tour starts and ends in Douglas. Limited to 15 participants. Includes admission to the City Museum and a 20% discount on select items in the museum store.
