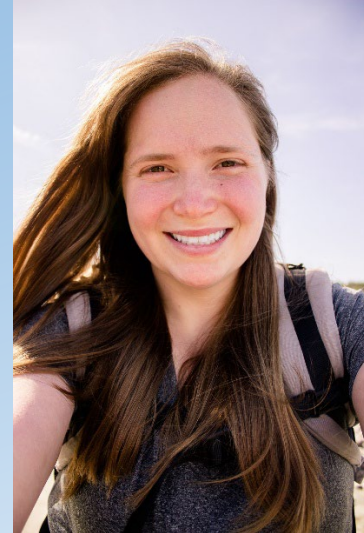

Juneau faces real challenges. Staffing shortages, budget constraints, and our unique geography affect every school in our district. I don't believe those challenges should end the conversation. I believe they should encourage us to ask better questions, think creatively, and work together to build stronger systems that support students and educators.

My commitment is simple. I will listen. I will ask questions. I will seek out different perspectives. And I will approach every decision by asking one question:
